

SUMMER SCHOOL & CAMP

OBJECTIVE

- To have children become true disciples of Jesus Christ.
- To provide a rich academic experience in a Christian environment.
- To customize a program that will cater to each child's needs — remedial or enrichment.



PHILOSOPHY:

If children become true disciples of Jesus Christ they will be motivated to pursue excellence in all areas of their lives—spiritual, academic, social.

All students who will be entering Kindergarten – Grade 12 are expected to enroll in summer school.

For **Kindergarten – Grade 9**, the program will consist of theme-based reading, related writing assignments, field trips, and instruction in mathematics.

Phonics

Phonics instruction will be provided for children in Kindergarten – Grade 3 and for older children who need a stronger foundation in this area.

REGENTS

The following will be provided for Junior High and High School students who will be entering **Grades 7 – 12** in the fall.

Integrated Algebra – High School credit may be earned; includes preparation for the Regents Examination.

English – High School credit may be earned; includes preparation for the Regents Examination.

Private Tutoring – for students who are preparing for other Regents examinations.

Friday Trips

Zoos, parks, science halls, museums, etc. within the Tri-state area.

WORSHIP is an integral part of our school/camp routines. This school/camp promotes Christian standards and requires all participants of the school/camp to follow its code of conduct, dress code and routines at all times.

Immediate compliance with school/camp rules is expected of each student. Insubordination results in suspension.

Mutual respect is expected of students, staff, visitors, and parents during all interactions at this center.

Parents will be responsible for the cost of repairs to any property damaged by their child. In addition, the child could be expelled.

RULES

This school/camp provides a safe, caring, wholesome and fun environment for both students and staff at all times.

Therefore, **there is a “zero” tolerance** for violating any of the following rules, and offenders could face suspension, expulsion, or legal consequences:

- Using illicit drugs of any form on or near the premises at any time.
- Expressing obscenities or profanities at any time.
- Bringing weapons or dangerous items to school/camp.
- Fighting or expressing lack of respect for teachers/counselors.

ATTIRE

Students and staff must dress and behave discreetly:

Skirts and shorts are to be no more than 2” above the knee. They must not be tight fitting. Blouses must properly conceal chest area and the whole torso. Pants must be worn with belts at the waist. Earrings should be no more than (1) inch in length or width. Boys are not permitted to wear earrings and headbands on the premises. Consequences include suspension.

NO: Wearing of headphones, playing radios, hats worn backwards, gum chewing, name calling, teasing, cheating, lying and stealing. Consequences may include confiscation of prohibited material, suspension and expulsion.

Students may not leave the site before the day’s program is completed or the director has received written permission from parents. Visiting by students’ friends is not permitted.

REGISTRATION

Registration – \$25.00 (This is a separate one-time fee.)

Summer School (six weeks) – \$140.00 per week. Weekly Trip \$ 25 /per trip

10% discount for additional children.

Additional 10% discount for every student registered and paid in full before June 1st.

PAYMENT OPTIONS:

- **Full payment prior to the start of Summer School.**
- **Two payments -**
1/2 of payment due by June 29th
Remaining balance due July 20th.
